How Long Do Fall Leaves Last in North Texas?

Leaf Drop – October through December

Leaf Drop – February

During the spring, trees will also start to grow new leaves. The old leaves will fall off and the trees will be green again by April or May. Spring is a good time to do annual irrigation maintenance. Sprinkler systems need to be checked for any damages incurred during the winter season.
